A Message from Monsignor Carr

Dear Liturgy Team,

Thank you for your pleasing service to the Lord and for stepping up during the summer when our schedule is challenging.

The summer gives me a chance to provide the following reminder of the dress code for all liturgy ministers. The following items of clothing are **NOT** permitted even in substitutes:

For Men:

Jeans, cargo pants, jogging pants
Casual shirts, tee shirts
Shorts
Sneakers, pool sandals, shower sandals, slippers

For Women:

Tank tops, tee shirts, form fitting spandex
Short skirts (defined as above the knee), jeans,
anything denim, cargo slacks
Shorts of any kind
Sneakers, flip flops, sandals, shower sandals, slippers


In carrying out our duties as Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers, it is imperative that we keep in mind where we are and what we are doing when we perform these duties. The Lord is actually present in the sanctuary in a most real sense. As ministers of His Word and of His Holy Body and Precious Blood, we have a duty to show the greatest respect and reverence for His presence. Our manner of dress is an expression of the respect and reverence we show the Lord while we are in the sanctuary performing our ministerial duties.

The essential principle of the dress code is the following: Our dress and mannerisms should not attract attention to ourselves, but instead demonstrate the reverence we show for the presence of the Holy Eucharist.

Attire should be conservative. Suits or jackets and ties for men; dresses, dress slacks and jackets, sweaters, blouses for women. Dress shoes for all. Under no circumstances should tops be low cut to show midriff or shoulders.

It is the intent of this policy that it be accepted in the manner in which it is presented, that is, in a sense of reverence for our Lord's real presence in the sanctuary and for the duties that we perform as Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers.

The title of the encyclical is *Laudato Sii*, and the subtitle *Sulla cura della casa comune*. *Laudato Sii* is translated as *Praised be*, and is a hallmark line from St. Francis' Canticle of the Creatures. *Sulla cura della casa comune* is translated as *On the care of the common home*. Papal teachings can be challenging for us and this encyclical is likely to have much hype on every side of the political spectrum. But these teachings are not meant to be solely political but meant to provide the theological and moral imperative for action in part to overcome political inertia. Debunking Some of the Myths Surrounding the Homeless: Getting a job will keep someone out of homelessness. As we work with CARITAS and other programs with the homeless it is good to know whether what we hear is true or not. The National Low Income Housing Coalition found a full-time minimum wage worker would have to work between 69 and 174 hours a week, depending on the state, to pay for an “affordable” two-bedroom rental unit (the federal government defines affordable as 30 percent of a person's income). In no state could a full-time minimum wage worker afford a one- or two-bedroom apartment at Fair Market Rent, a standard set by the federal government.
