Help/Guardian Needed: St. Bridget Church has been contacted by a foster care social worker (Erica Thornton) with Montgomery County Department of Social Services in Christiansburg, VA. She is in desperate need of help with a young man that resides in the Midlothian area. Youth are able to be in foster care until their 21st birthday. This particular young man will turn 21 in September. He has not had consistent contact with his birth family for several years. She has been searching for a Guardian for him since his 17th birthday, with no success. While he is 20 years old, most of his skills are on a 2 – 3 year old level. He resides in a program in Midlothian, where he receives excellent care. He will be able to reside in this program for the rest of his life. The program is paid for by the Intellectually Disabled Waiver along with his Social Security benefits. So, the individual that becomes his guardian would not be responsible for him financially nor would they be responsible for his finances – his program takes care of paying all of his bills. The person that would be identified as his Guardian would need to be at least 21 years old, would need to have a "clear" criminal background, they would need to come to court in Montgomery county - one or two times (we would try to have all paperwork completed at one court hearing), they would need to provide Erica with demographic information about themselves, they would be required to visit with this young man at least once every three months, and would need to assist his program manager in making decisions for him. This is a volunteer position as the state does not pay Guardians. Erica is reaching out in the hopes that we will share this information. If you or anyone you know is interested in learning more about this Guardianship or interested in learning more about this young man, please do not hesitate to contact me. Erica visits with him monthly and would be glad to visit with you at that time or speak to you by phone. **Thank you for all you do and for your consideration in regards to this special guy!** - Erica Thornton (540) 382-6990 ext. #3462
