## Lent 2017: Information and Dates

### Benediction and Stations of the Cross

6:30 pm Fridays during Lent except on Good Friday

### Saturdays of Lent

Holy Hour and Benediction after Daily Mass

Daily Mass, Monday-Saturday, 8am and Confessions on Saturdays from 4-5pm

### Fasting and Abstaining Rules

*Fasting* is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

*Abstinence* is covered by all 14 years of age and older. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Good Friday, April 14, 2017, is a day of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

**A gift from St. Bridget:** we offer a nursery at no-charge to our young families. Following is part of a series of information about this nursery which can be found in full on the parish website. Regular users are asked to register your child(ren) and sign up to help at one Mass every three months.

**Keeping things sanitized** – We do our best to keep the nursery as clean as possible. Just before snack time we sanitize the tables where the children will eat, and they all get a squirt of hand sanitizer in their hands, which they eagerly rub together so that Goldfish and other goodies can be served. We want to know about any food allergies your child has so that we avoid buying any snacks that could be a problem. If we see a child put a toy in his or her mouth, we gently take it away to wash and sanitize it. And periodically everything in the nursery is sanitized, including every year during the parish Lenten day of service when a group comes in to give the nursery an extra good cleaning! ...to be continued
