## Lent 2017: Information and Dates

### Benediction and Stations of the Cross

6:30 pm Fridays during Lent except on Good Friday

### Saturdays of Lent

Holy Hour and Benediction after Daily Mass

Daily Mass, Monday-Saturday, 8am and Confessions on Saturdays from 4-5pm

### Fasting and Abstaining Rules

*Fasting* is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

*Abstinence* is covered by all 14 years of age and older. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Good Friday, April 14, 2017, is a day of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

**A gift from St. Bridget:** we offer a nursery at no-charge to our young families. Following is part of a series of information about this nursery which can be found in full on the parish website. Regular users are asked to register your child(ren) and sign up to help at one Mass every three months.

**At your service:** We changed the nursery back in 2011 from being staffed solely by parent volunteers to having paid staff to care for our parish children. All four of these women have been trained in the diocesan VIRTUS Protecting All Children program. Jackie Dwyer and Colby Nauth were hired in the fall of 2011, followed by Adessa Lebrun in autumn of 2012, and Erin Garnett in the fall of 2015. Below is information on two of our staff, with the other two to be featured next week.



Mrs. Lebrun ("Miss Adessa"), who works in the nursery every Sunday, has worked with children all of her adult life. She was a teacher back home in St. Lucia and has worked as a childcare provider since moving to the USA in 2011. She and her husband, Alwin, have an eight-year-old son.



Mrs. Nauth ("Miss Colby") works in the nursery every other Sunday and has many years of experience as a nanny and a babysitter. She worked as the lead teacher in St. Michael's after-school program from 2014 to 2016 and currently works with children with autism. She has completed some coursework in

early childhood education and is CPR/AED certified through the American Heart Association.
