It is a liturgy of great contrast, from triumph to death in one liturgical celebration. May it invite you to walk this journey with Jesus throughout Holy Week!

During Holy Week, Catholics around the world will walk with Jesus, from the Last Supper where he shows us what it means to love and serve one another, to Calvary where he shows us what it means to love one another by laying down one's life, to the tomb and then to the bright light of his resurrection where love is completed in redemption. These are our highest holy days. Let us do as the Lenten proclamation urged: declare a fast, call an assembly! Now is the acceptable time for us all to set time apart . . . To remember, to celebrate and so to believe.

Statement from the Most Reverend Francis X. DiLorenzo, Bishop of Richmond on the Passing of William Cardinal Keeler

(Richmond, Va.) - The Most Reverend Francis X. DiLorenzo released the following statement today on the passing of William Cardinal Keeler, 14th Archbishop of Baltimore:

"Today, I, along with the clergy, religious communities and the faithful of the Diocese of Richmond, offer our prayers to the Catholic community within the Archdiocese of Baltimore on the death of William Cardinal Keeler. Many in our Diocese will remember that Cardinal Keeler served as Apostolic Administrator in Richmond between Sept. 16, 2003 until my installation as Bishop, May 24, 2004.

"May all who mourn his passing find comfort in the Lord and solace for his long service and devotion to the Church. Please join me as we pray for the repose of the soul of Cardinal Keeler, may he rest in peace."

Please join us on any Saturday morning for 8:00 am Mass followed by the Holy Rosary. Each decade is announced ahead of time, and then after that anyone is free to lead the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be. The Good Lord and Blessed Mother will be listening! Hope to see you!

A gift from St. Bridget: we offer a nursery at no-charge to our young families. Following is part of a series of information about this nursery which can be found in full on the parish website. Regular users are asked to register your child(ren) and sign up to help at one Mass every three months.

At your service: We changed the nursery back in 2011 from being staffed solely by parent volunteers to having paid staff to care for our parish children. All four of these women have been trained in the diocesan VIRTUS Protecting All Children program. Jackie Dwyer and Colby Nauth were hired in the fall of 2011, followed by Adessa Lebrun in autumn of 2012, and Erin Garnett in the fall of 2015. Two of our staff were featured last week, and the other two are below:



Mrs. Garnett ("Miss Erin") typically works in the nursery one day a month. As a teenager she worked as a babysitter, a camp counselor and a volunteer with children, and she has worked for the past 11 years as a certified public preschool teacher and in-home therapist in special and general education settings. She and her husband, Tom, have two daughters (ages five and 1 1/2 years) with another daughter due in May. She also has CPR/AED certification.



Mrs. Dwyer ("Miss Jackie") is a retired grandmother who averages about one Sunday a month in the nursery. She has taken child psychology courses and was active as a Girl Scout volunteer during the 13 years her daughter was a Girl Scout. She and her husband, Dan, were foster

parents to five young children when the Heal the Children program had a chapter here in Richmond. She successfully completed the CPR/AED class offered by the parish last year.

In addition to these adults, we often have teen helpers in the nursery who get service hours or are paid \$10/Mass. For information about using the nursery or becoming a teen helper, please stop in to see us in the nursery before or after either Sunday morning Mass.
