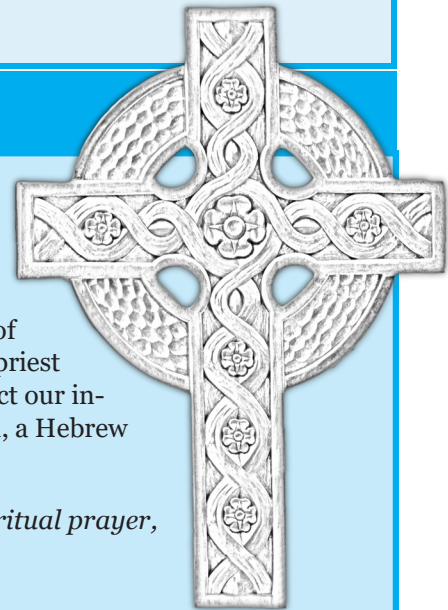
Deeper Faith Summer Series

Gathering Rites (Week 3 of 8)

Join us this summer for an eight-week "Deeper Faith Summer Series" with weekly lessons on the Mass.

This week's focus is on the gathering rites of the Mass. These rituals include greetings, the use of holy water, genuflection and/or bowing, posture, song, ritual dialogue, a shared acknowledgment of our sin and God's great mercy, and our shared singing of the great hymn of praise we call The Gloria. The gathering rites conclude with the opening prayer, where the priest asks us to join our minds and hearts in prayer. After a few moments of silence, he will collect our intentions (which is why this prayer is called a "Collect") and we will, together, respond Amen, a Hebrew word meaning "So be it."
