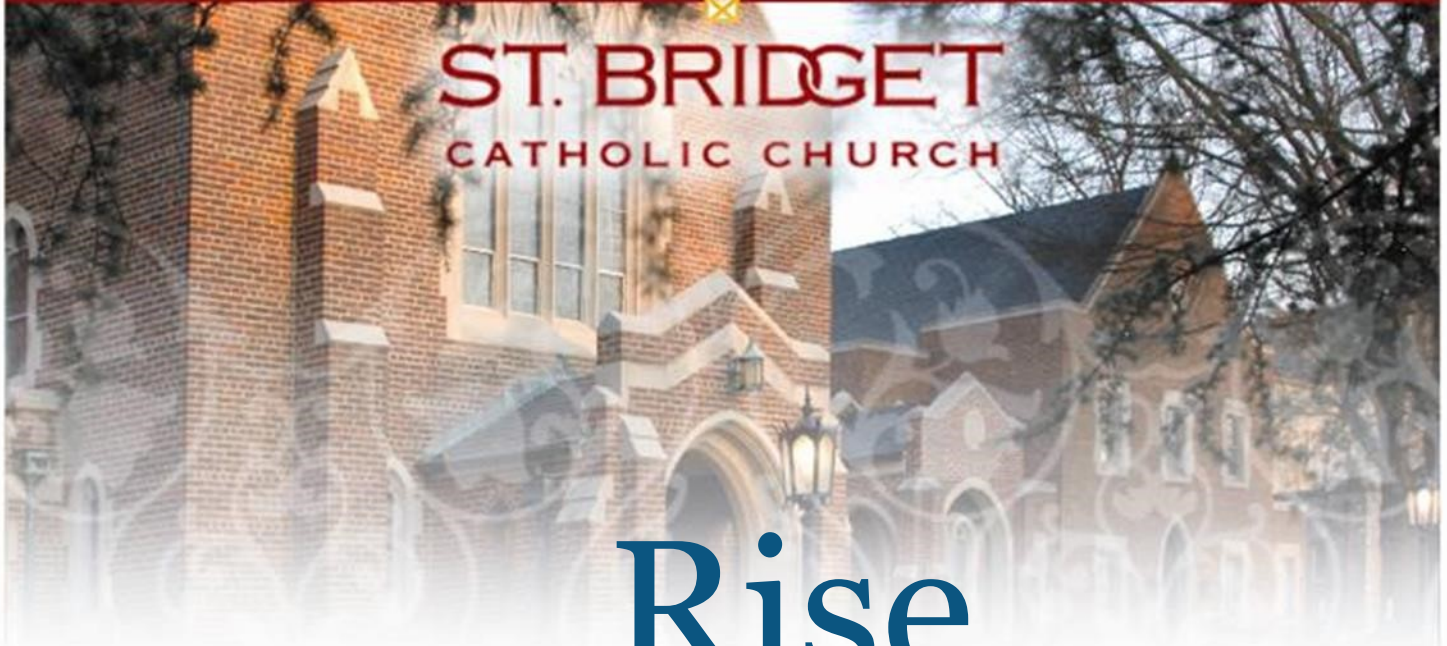

IVNA is able to offer the Quadrivalent vaccine for \$32 per shot again this year. The High Dose vaccine is the flu vaccine recommended for persons over 65 years of age. IVNA will be able to offer the High Dose vaccine for \$54 per shot again this year.

Either vaccine is covered by most insurances/Medicare or we can accept Cash/Check at the time of the clinic. We are happy to administer to family members ages 12 and up.

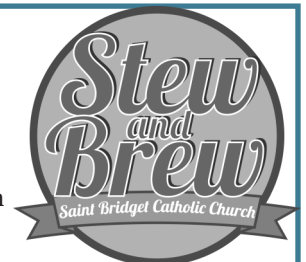
