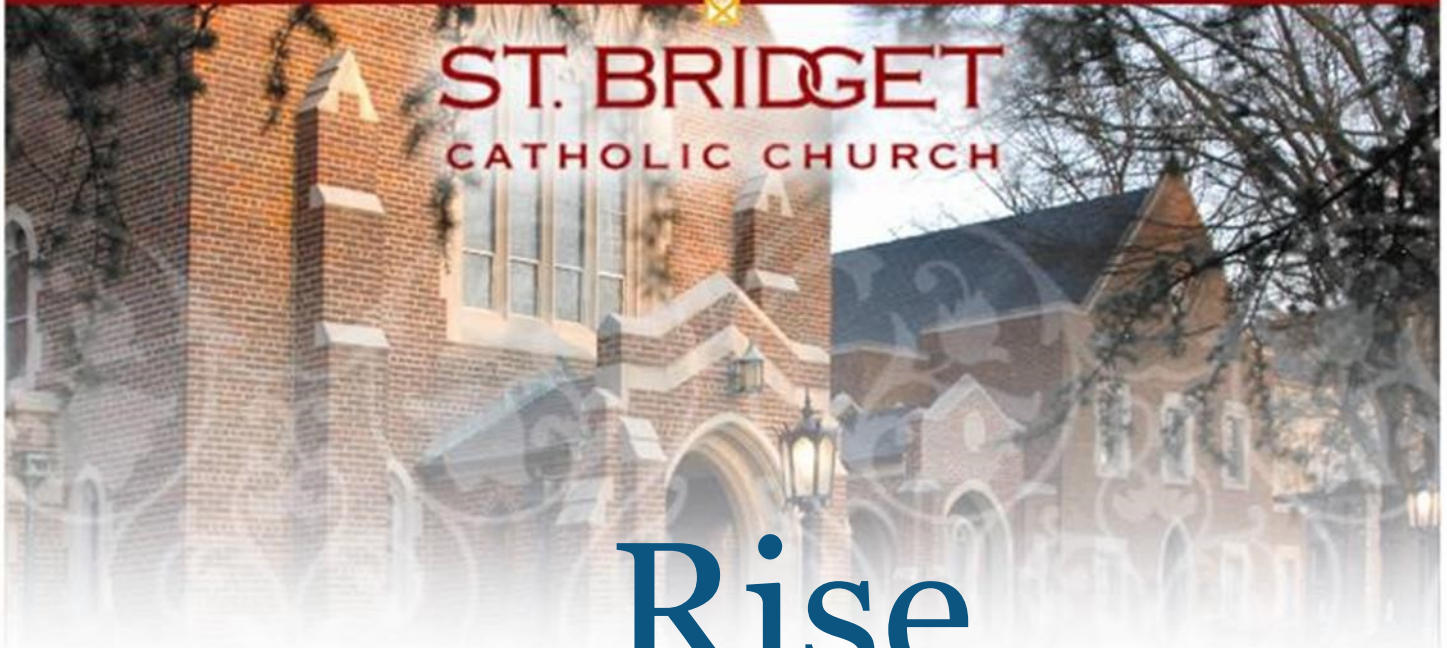

February 1 is the Feast of St. Brigid or Brigid, who was born in the year 451 AD in [Faughart, Ireland](#). Despite the legendary quality of the earliest accounts of her life, three biographies agree that her mother was Brocca, a Christian [Pict](#) and slave who had been baptized by [Saint Patrick](#). They named her father as Dubhthach, a chieftain of [Leinster](#). The vitae say that Brigid's mother was a slave and that Dubhthach's wife forced him to sell her to a druid when she became pregnant. Brigid herself was born into slavery. From the start, it was clear that Brigid was holy. As she grew older, Brigid performed many miracles, including healing and feeding the poor. According to one tale, as a child, she once gave away her mother's entire store of butter. The butter was then replenished in answer to Brigid's prayers. Around the age of ten, she was returned as a household servant to her father, where her habit of charity also led her to donate his belongings to anyone who asked.
