Parish Christian Formation

Our parish pastoral council is undertaking a thorough review of Christian Formation in our parish. To that end they have established a committee headed by council member Ann Slough. This committee will examine Church documents concerning Christian Formation in parishes, assess current programs, develop a comprehensive vision for our parish, write a job description, search and hire.

This work will take place with an awareness of the parish liturgy committee's Real Presence efforts and our New Evangelization Team's vision for our parish.

Parish Evangelization

I would like our parish family to engage more with the Holy Father's call for a new evangelization. To that end, we have a New Evangelization Team who report to the Parish Pastoral Council. We will also begin work with a consultant who will guide us in that good work.

We share that Good News according to our personality and gifts. We share the Good News wherever God puts us every day and we do the best we can with what we've got.

New Rectory Resident

It is a pleasure for me to welcome as a resident in our rectory Father Sunil of the Syro Malabar Catholic Church. Father Sunil is the pastor of Richmond's Syro Malabar parish of about 50 families. They have no church nor rectory.

They celebrate Sunday Masses on Sunday afternoons at nearby St. Benedict Church and I am happy to welcome Father Sunil to the rectory. Father Sunil has no parish duties here.

The Syro Malabar Church is one of twenty two Oriental Churches in full communion with Rome. They have more than four million members and trace their beginnings to the journey of St. Thomas the Apostle to south west India.
