A message from George Sadler – Principal, Saint Bridget School

I would like to update the parish community about our exciting Middle School building project. Our wonderful community continues to support this ongoing work and it is truly a blessing to be a part of it. Currently the historic Westhampton Baptist Church building is undergoing major renovations and will soon become the new Saint Bridget Middle School.

The contractors are currently busy replacing all of the major systems in this historic structure. As of this date, electrical, plumbing, plaster, HVAC, and roof work are in full swing. In addition gutters, water lines, ventilation and sprinkler systems are being installed. The centerpiece of the restoration is the original sanctuary built in 1914. The sanctuary will be restored as a performing arts center while preserving the original character of the room.

Earlier in the month the school hosted its third Ignite the Light meeting for parents, teachers, and other members of our community. It provided an opportunity for our stakeholders to generate ideas concerning the future of Saint Bridget School. Our first meeting created a new Middle School. I can only imagine what is in store for us in the future.
