Helping Parents who missed one or both of the Retreat Sessions

Welcome to sacramental preparation! This is a beautiful and exciting time and we are pleased to partner with you to make the first celebrations of Reconciliation and Eucharist memorable firsts of a lifetime of participation.

The Diocese of Richmond has provided us with an Instruction on the preparation for First Reconciliation. In it, they indicate that each parish should partner with parents to do two things in this time period:

- Provide parents more knowledge about each sacrament, at adult levels
- Partner with parents by offering help and support for integrating sacramental preparation into the faith life in their homes

Saint Bridget parish offered two retreats for the Sacrament of Reconciliation to get families off on this journey together. We are so sorry you were unable to join us for one or both of these retreats! So that you are supported in your role as the primary teacher of your children in the ways of faith, we've put together this at-home "retreat" for your use. It is designed to do as the Diocese directs, giving you some additional understanding of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and providing some At-Home Hints.

- Dates for children's celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation 1/14/17 OR 1/21/17.
 9:00AM or by special arrangement. Contact Julie Koury if you prefer to make a special arrangement for First Reconciliation.
- Dates for retreats for First Eucharist preparation February 12, March 19 and April 2. 12:30-2:30PM. One parent and the child preparing are required to attend all three.

Using the materials at home Try and do as much of this as you can!

- Spend time going through each of the lessons with your child. Experiment with the suggestions for engaging them as they are based on sound learning principles. As you move through the lessons, you'll discover which activities most engage your child and you can tailor the time.

I'd like to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation myself. What do I do?

- 2. Use one or more of the handouts on the website to help you examine your conscience.
- 3. Feel free to print one of the guides to the sacrament that includes an Act of Contrition and bring it with you.
- 4. If you would like some extended time to talk with the priest, get some spiritual guidance as well as penance make an appointment for the Sacrament so you are not rushed.
- 5. Saint Bridget Church offers confessions on Saturday afternoon beginning at 4:00PM or anytime by appointment. Times for confession at other parishes are usually easily found on their websites or by telephone. Some find going to another parish simplifies the process. Feel free!
- 6. During Advent and Lent the parish will offer multiple times for the sacrament. Neighboring parishes may have communal services to which you are welcome. If you've not been in a while, attending one of these communal services can help you prepare and give the Holy Spirit a chance to call you to the celebration. There's no imperative to go to individual confession at one of these services, but the opportunity is there if the Holy Spirit calls!
- Feel free to celebrate the sacrament during the services for your children on January 14th or 21st.
