Human Concerns: Our Continuing Efforts in Haiti and how the Girl Scouts are helping!



Girl Scout Troop 5158

The Girl Scouts of Troop 5158 meet one Wednesday a month after school to have fun, build friendships and learn new things about their community and the world they live in. Everyone loves Girl Scout cookies and the girls of troop 5158 decided to use some of the funds they raised from their cookie sales this past spring to sponsor a child in Carrisade, Haiti. Won't you consider sponsoring a child in Haiti? Your sponsorship will bring education and lunch to a child. It will help pay for teachers, a nurse and even the infrastructure needed to keep this community in Haiti healthy - and help all the people there thrive. St. Bridget along with the Cathedral of Sacred Heart has been involved in Haiti since around 1997 when we began a relationship with the people of Carissade which was a mission of Sacred Heart Church in Hinche, Haiti. Carissade is more of a rural area than a specific village. The first thing we did was to build a church which was dedicated in 1998 and was named St. Paul. It became a focal point for our efforts drawing people from the surrounding country side. The next thing we did was to build a 6-classroom building which went up in 2002, then a grain mill was finished in 2003. With all the people coming to this new focal point we helped put in latrines in 2004 to safeguard the sanitation of this growing focal point. A second school building was put up in 2005, and a cafeteria in 2006. There are now 420 students who come to this focal point we created in Carissade for their primary education. We provide the salaries for the teachers, a school nurse who also sees the parents, and we provide a lunch for the children which for many is the only meal they eat. In this rural area we are providing an elementary education to children whose parents never had an opportunity to get an education, which means the children can read where the parents cannot. In addition to reading they study math, science and catechism and we have opened a new world to the people of Carissade.

Not only can they read but they can understand such things as where diseases come from and how they are transmitted. Reason can begin to displace superstition and the children can take their place as responsible citizens in the second oldest democracy in the western hemisphere. Moving forward we are tryin to identify ways we can help develop the economy in Carissade.

Please consider a \$150 sponsorship in the name of a child at your primary school in Carissade on the central plateau. Alternatively, use the second collection on the second weekend of the month to donate whatever you can afford to help those who have so much less than us. Your sponsorship contributes to the school, health clinic, and economic development efforts with our sisters and brothers in Carissade, Haiti.

Youth Groups are alive and well at St. Bridget this fall! After a summer of vacations, multiple Catholic Heart Work Camp mission trips, bible studies, baseball games, a James River tubing trip for St. Bridget School's 8th grade boys and our first group of Confirmed Teens (Young Apostles) attending a Stuebenville Youth Conferece in Atlanta, there was a lot of enthusiasm to kick off the school year.

The St. Bridget community is incredible and we saw the beauty of our young church in action as many joined together for the SpeakUp 5K in September. Last spring we suddenly lost youth group member and Confirmation candidate, Cameron Gallagher. Cameron dreamed of putting on a race to raise money and awareness for children who live with mental illness. The SpeakUp 5k was not only the realization of her dream, but was an incredible witness to Cameron's role in the Body of Christ and her ability to bring the community together. It was an awesome day and a great celebration.

This year the middle and high school youth groups will be looking at our faith through the perspective of "God is…" This theme gives us a chance to look at the nature of God, the work of the Church, meaning of salvation and the personal connection that God is seeking with all of us. In addition to the theme, each youth group meeting includes music and prayer to prepare students to take the next step in going deeper into their faith as the year unfolds.

We very much appreciate the prayers of the community and parishioner support of our endeavors which help students to grow in their faith. We are excited about this year's opportunities for retreats, conferences, leadership, community and faith building including the March for Life, new service offerings to connect youth with homebound parishioners, the Young Apostles leadership team for Juniors and Seniors who have received the sacrament of Confirmation, a new take on the Confirmation retreat and participation in the Winter "Mount 2000" retreat at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Maryland.
