Better Opportunities, Better Futures

St. Bridgets parish and the Human Concerns Committee are excited to announce our growing participation in the Armstrong Priorities Freshman Academy.

Two-thirds of the students who enter Armstrong High School in the east end of Richmond are at least two grade levels behind in reading and math. The goal of Freshman Academy is to help these students make up this lost ground so that they can graduate with their class and have the opportunity to go on to college. The Academy provides tutoring in small group settings; one-on-one mentoring by volunteers; and after school programs and activities for both students and their parents.

Armstrong High School has a proud heritage. It was the first public school in Richmond to serve the educational needs of African American young people after the Civil War. The school has produced many prominent African American citizens of Richmond. The reasons that current students often fall behind are not hard to understand. Most are poor. The school serves the highest concentration of low-income students in the Richmond area. Over 75% of the students qualify for free or reduced priced

lunches. Five housing projects feed into the school. Unemployment in those projects often reaches 50%. Many students come from single-parent homes. The lure of the streets is constant. The highest drop-out rate is between the ninth and tenth grades, which is why the Academy concentrates on freshmen.

Despite many obstacles, these students want the same opportunities all young people want. Many want to become doctors, lawyers, and business people. Some are talented



and driven and will make their dreams come true. Many, however, will struggle unless they have help.

The faith communities of the east end want to provide that help. Over a dozen churches are involved, including Richmond Hill, the ecumenical faith center housed in the former Monte Maria convent in Church Hill, and Holy Rosary parish, the Catholic parish closest to Armstrong.

St. Bridget has already begun to participate in the program in partnership with Holy Rosary, Richmond's oldest existing African American Roman Catholic Church. Of course, we work with good people from all of the denominations, but particularly through this program, we hope to build an ever-deepening relationship with our fellow Catholics at Holy Rosary.


The Armstrong Priorities Freshman Academy is just finishing its first year. This school year we identified and worked with 60 students who we judged to be at most risk academically. Some are beginning to make impressive strides. Others still struggle. But all are seeing opportunities, and all are seeing that people care about them. In the students' own words:

First Reconciliation and First Eucharist






